investigated promptly, and appropriate action taken in line with statutory guidelines and club procedures.

Training and Awareness

All staff, volunteers, and relevant personnel will receive appropriate training on child protection issues, including recognising signs of abuse, responding to concerns, and understanding their responsibilities under this policy.
